Dining Services

Portfolio in Motion 2008 garnered significant media attention. *Women’s Wear Daily* featured an interview with Designer of the Year Cynthia Rowley on April 29. The weekend following

the show, *The Washington Post* “Names & Faces” column included a mention of Ms. Rowley’s honor. Meanwhile, *Washingtonian* magazine online had a three-part blog on Ms. Rowley and the event. The *Arlington Sun Gazette* also featured a story on the show.

The record \$3 million gift to Marymount by prominent northern Virginia real estate owner and developer Preston C. Caruthers for the 26th Street project – the largest single gift in the institution’s history – also made headlines in the *Arlington Connection*, the *Catholic Herald*, and the *Arlington Sun Gazette*.
